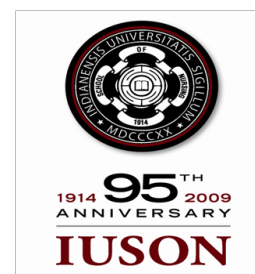

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Continuing Medical Education Information

Course Description

Intended for physicians and the interdisciplinary team who provide medical care to elderly adults, this course will offer an update on diagnosis, treatment, and management of a number of common health issues in the geriatrics population, along with relating the economical impact on clinical care of older adults, how to make a difference, and the impact of the new health care reform. Topics will include healthcare reform, relationship of functional status to cost of care, mental health for older adults, medication interactions, polypharmacy in geriatric patients, technologies to improve functional status, atrial fibrillation assessment and treatment, the Indiana Infection Initiative, interprofessional team building skills, dementia update, and the assessment and treatment of strokes in the elderly. The Indiana Geriatrics Society is a state affiliate of the American Geriatrics Society. The overall mission of The Indiana Geriatrics Society is to enhance the visibility of Geriatrics in Indiana. We hope to do this by providing local educational programs in geriatrics, promoting interdisciplinary care of older adults, and providing input to the national organization on policy issues.

Course Objectives

At the conclusion of the program, participants should be able to:

- Demonstrate an increased awareness for geriatric care concerning atrial fibrillation, dementia, drug-drug interactions, polypharmacy, strokes, mental health, and functional status. .
- Describe the impact and costs of the functional status of the healthcare for the elderly in Indiana and identify ways to assist or improve their functional status.
- Incorporate the concepts of new initiatives in Indiana with the focus on improving the quality of care for older adults.
- Apply the principles of interprofessional team skills in the care of geriatric care for older adult.
- Identify geriatric resources for questions, support, and referrals concerning the care of older adults.

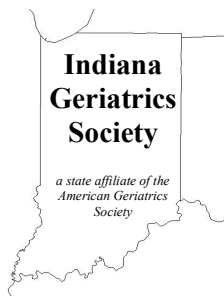
