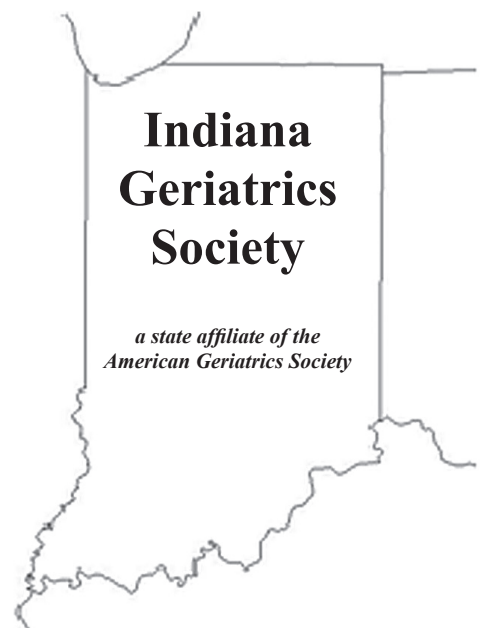

The 2011 Update: Geriatric Interdisciplinary Best Practices

conference is intended for physicians and non-physician interdisciplinary colleagues who provide medical care to elderly adults. This conference will update attendees on: innovations in making a difference in the quality of care for older adults; the impact of current issues in healthcare reform; and state-of-the-art updates in diagnosis, treatment and management of a number of common health issues affecting the geriatric population.

Topics will specifically include: how healthcare professionals can prevent elder financial fraud and investment exploitation; older adult care transitions with emergency medicine; Parkinson's disease; chronic pain therapy and addiction management; anti-coagulation therapy; geriatric drug updates; evaluation and management of delirium updates; background on development of the POLST (Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment) in Indiana; Medicare reimbursement; and current issues in healthcare reform.

The Indiana Geriatrics Society (IGS) is a state affiliate of the American Geriatrics Society. The overall mission of IGS is to enhance the visibility of geriatrics in Indiana. We hope to do this by providing local educational programs in geriatrics, promoting interdisciplinary care of older adults, and providing input to the national organization on public policy issues.

At the conclusion of the program, participants should be able to:

- Demonstrate an increased awareness of key components for geriatric care concerning the following: Parkinson's disease, pain management, anti-coagulation, delirium and polypharmacy.
- Describe current ways to recognize and prevent elder financial fraud.
- Identify the key components and critical information for older adults transitioning in and out of emergency rooms.
- Incorporate research outcomes of the utilization of the POLST form and future legal initiatives in Indiana focusing on improving the quality of life for older adults and the increasing need to discuss goals of care with all patients, not just those with terminal illnesses.
- Apply the principles of quality documentation to meet the requirements of Medicare guidelines for maximum reimbursement.
- List the current issues in healthcare reform that affect future geriatric care for older adults.
