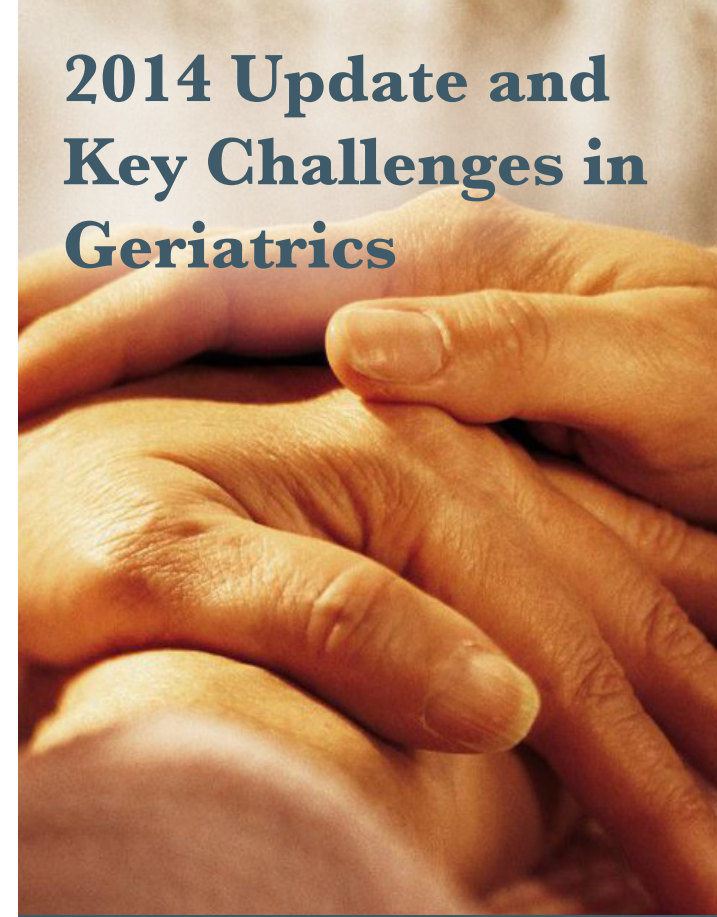

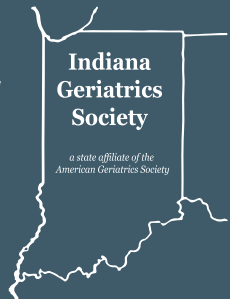

The 8th Annual IGS Fall Conference entitled, "2014 Update and Key Challenges in Geriatrics" is intended for physicians and non-physician inter-professional colleagues who provide medical care to elderly adults. Attendees will learn about the current challenges in geriatric care for the state of Indiana, review the trends of the readmissions of older adults to the hospital, how to make a difference with the implementation of a national program concerning the care for older adults, the impact of current issues in health care reform, and state-of-the-art updates in diagnosis, treatment, and management of a number of common health issues and challenges affecting the geriatric population.

Topics will specifically include updates on a recent statewide survey about the specific needs of older adults from both the Division of Aging and the Long-Term Care Division, trends of thirty-day hospital readmissions from a rural and urban perspective, current issues in healthcare reform from a national perspective; a review of safe prescribing and treatment of delirium and insomnia in the elderly; the impact of the national program "Choosing Wisely" to improve the care of older adults, update on the issues and care of older adults related to elder abuse, and update on safe driving evaluation and the impact of delayed decision making, and more. The Indiana Geriatrics Society (IGS) is a state affiliate of the American Geriatrics Society. The overall mission of IGS is to enhance the visibility of Geriatrics in Indiana. We hope to do this by providing local educational programs in geriatrics, promoting interdisciplinary care of older adults, and providing input to the national organization on public policy issues.

At the conclusion of the program, participants should be able to:

- Describe the current statewide needs of older adults and identify key areas of concern for future planning.
- List the trends of thirty-day hospital readmissions from a rural and urban perspective and identify mechanisms to prevent in the future.
- Describe the national initiative of the ABIM Foundation, "Choosing Wisely" and review the evidence-based recommendations that should be discussed to help make wise decisions about the most appropriate care based on a patients' individual situation.
- Outline the specific reasons older adults suffer from insomnia and identify ways to improve the quality of sleep.
- Describe important assessment skills needed to identify the potential risks of elder abuse and describe mechanisms to promote prevention.
- Describe how to identify delirium and discuss strategies to decrease and prevent delirium.
- Outline the steps of conducting a safe driving evaluation and list the potential outcomes of delayed decision making.
- Identify the current legislative activities which will have an impact on the care of older adults.
